FOREST SERVICE ROADS

Discussion was held concerning paying Harold Wilson for his services and for reimbursement of expenses on the RS-2477 project. Motion made by Commissioner Shenton, seconded by Vadnais that Harold Wilson be paid for services. Commissioner Wilson abstained because of the conflict of interest, Harold being his son.




AGREEMENT WITH ITD ON WEED CONTROL

"UNACCEPTABLE SPECIES ORDINANCE"


BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF CLARK COUNTY COMMISSIONERS:


It shall be deemed unacceptable when the Endangered Species Act is employed to introduce or reintroduce any animal which is a threat to the public safety, and will therefore be the responsibility of the County Commissions of Clark County, State of Idaho, to take any and all measures necessary to protect its citizens.


Adopted and approved this 23 day of March, 1998.
