

MINUTES OF THE REGULAR MEETING OF THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS

CLARK COUNTY

May 9, 1994

The Board met this day in regular session. Present were Commissioners Charles R. Vadnais, Steven R. Gilger and Charles E. Wilson, Prosecuting Attorney Craig Simpson and Clerk JoAnn S. Tavenner.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES

Motion by Commissioner Wilson, seconded by Commissioner Gilger unanimous that the April meeting minutes are hereby approved as written.

COMMUNICATION

Sybile Wilding, met with the Commission and informed them of the savings that they can get through signing up with AT&T for their long distant calls. She said that the county could save from 20 to 30% on long distance business calls and 30 to 40% on conference calls plus they can also receive a 2% commission if an organization.

After some discussion the commission decided to check with the telephone company and then get back to Sybile.

CIVIL DEFENSE EXERCISE

Donald W. Shenton, Civil Defense Director, met with the Commission and informed them that he is holding a table top (earth tremor) exercise on April 25, 1994 at 10:00 a.m. Shenton said he would like as many as possible to take part in the exercise. On Local Emergency Planning Commission the group discussed joining forces with Jefferson county and trading commissioners every several month to attend meetings; Shenton will keep in touch and let the Commission know when its there turn.

The group discussed need to renewing lease with Radar Grazing Association on the ground that the repeater station sets on. After a short discussion it was unanimous that the lease should be renewed for a period of five years.

REQUEST FOR CHANGE ON VALUES

Blaine Larsen and Jim Bell met with the Board and informed them that they have a problem with 4200 acres of farm ground which is being assessed as irrigated ag.in Clark County. Larsen said that in the past he had transferred water from CRP ground in other county to Clark County and this year they are not allowed this practice; so he is requesting that the value be changed from

irrigated ag. to non-irrigated on these parcels. Larsen was advised to talk to the Assessor and then if he not satisfied he could come to the commissioners.

INCREASE IN ADMINISTRATIVE FEE

Betty Kirkpatrick, Assessor met with the Commission and requested that the Commission increase her administrative fees on licensing vehicles from \$2.00 to \$2.50 After a short discussion Motion by Commissioner Wilson, seconded by Commissioner Gilger, unanimous that the Assessor is hereby authorized to increase the administrative fee from \$2.00 to \$2.50 per vehicle effect June 1, 1994.

ROAD & BRIDGE UP-DATE

David McKinney, Engineer from Keller & Associates, and Rod Belcher, Road & Bridge Supervisor, met with the Commission to discuss what has been done towards getting on with the Kilgore East Road and possibility of federal funding to help get this project moving and finished. The group discussed stream alternate permits, materials available, right of ways needed and bridge standards. McKinney estimated the cost of project to be around \$650,000 and said his costs would be \$22,000 to get this project moving.

Motion by Commissioner Wilson, seconded by Commissioner Gilger that the county pay \$22,000 to Keller Associates to get the Kilgore East Project going.

Rod Belcher, Road & Bridge Supervisor informed the Commission of projects going on in his departments: Belcher said they are putting cinders on the Jacoby road and have cleaned up Siepert's corner; He said they are hauling gravel from Button Butte pit . A discussion was held on loaning or renting out equipment - Belcher brought up the renting out of the compressor to Mark Mattison after which he presented the Commission with a minute enter from May 13, 1985 which stated that as of that date " the county policy for leasing or renting county road equipment for personal or private use will be terminated." Belcher said he has scheduled five miles of the Montevue road for seal coating ; he would also like to seal coat a couple miles on the Medicine Lodge road and complete another mile on the Red Road. He said he has been looking at a portable screening plant - He said if he had one he could get some of the big material off and have a lot better base material. The plants cost from twenty to fifty some thousand.

UP-DATE ON WEED DEPARTMENT

Keith Bramwell met with the Commission and informed them that his weed crew is ready to go. He said they have spotted nap weed in the Birch Creek area and thistle up Corral Creek. He said that on June 21 thru 23 they would be spraying highway and railroad right-of-ways again in the coop agreement with Montana.

SHOOTING RANGE

Destry G. Hunting met with the Commission and informed them he is doing a shooting range as his Boy Scout project. Destry described to the Commission where he planned to build the shooting range and explained what he would need to complete the project. After some discussion the Commissioners informed Destry that they could furnish him with two loads of sand or gravel; Commissioner Vadnais donated the posts that Destry needed and he was told to check with Tom Gooch or Chuck Forsbough with BLM for there approval before starting his project.

FOREST SERVICE UP-DATE

Mac Murdock, Forest Service , met with the Commission and informed them that they have moved into their new office. He said that the Forest Service and BLM are working together to come up with a range land reform. He said that on Saturday May 21, 1994 an all day citizens involvement meeting will be held at the Lindy Ross School and invited the Commissioners to attend. Murdock also said that Jerry Reese is the new Targhee Supervisor and would be attending the above meeting.

CANCELLATION OF WARRANT

Jo Ann S. Tavenner, Auditor ask the Commission for a cancellation on a Road & Bridge warrant, No. 94-1000, in the amount of \$105.00 issued on April 11, 1994 to Dave Nelson. Tavenner said reason for the cancellation is this is a duplication of a previous payment.

Motion by Commissioner Gilger, seconded by Commissioner Wilson unanimous that the above warrant is hereby cancelled.
