

**MINUTES OF THE REGULAR MEETING OF THE BOARD
OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS
CLARK COUNTY, IDAHO**

MAY 11,1998

The Board met this day in regular session. Present were: Commissioners' Charles R. Vadnais, Charles E. Wilson and Gregory A. Shenton, Clerk Jo Ann S.Tavenner and Prosecuting Attorney Craig Simpson, absent.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES

Motion by Commissioner Shenton, seconded by Commissioner Wilson, unanimous that the minutes for the month of April, 1998 be approved as written.

EXTENSION SERVICE

Ray Prigge, District Director, University of Idaho, dropped by to see how things are going in his department. He informed the board that Janice Simpson is available for their use, if the Board feels they need her services.

SHERIFFS' VEHICLES & PARKING FRONT OF BUILDING

Craig King, Sheriff, met with the Commissioner concerning whether to buy or continue leasing vehicles for his department. He said it would cost around \$4748.00 per year to lease. After some discussion it was unanimous that the Commission would prefer to lease as long as possible unless the cost gets out of hand.

The Group also discussed Juvenile Detention. King informed the Commission they are going to use Fremont County for juveniles until the detention center is complete and the rest of the counties will take Fremont Countys' adults. He said Clark County will keep holding Bonneville County prisoner and a couple from one of the other counties. King

will be attending a juvenile housing meeting tomorrow and invited one or all of the commissioners to go.

A discussion was held on parking area in front of courthouse. Motion by Commissioner Wilson, seconded by Commissioner Shenton unanimous that the employees park on the east side and at the back of the building and leave the front for customers with the exception of the first two parking places (east end) which will be blocked off or painted no parking for visibility and safety purposes.

LEONARD TO FENCE LAND

Boyd Leonard met with the Commissioners and requested permission to fence in his land that the stockmen at one time designated and used as a holding pen when trailing cattle. Leonard said that there is no water there and it is not used by anyone. He said he would stay back off the road the same distance as the rest of the right-of-way (132 feet). Motion by Commissioner Shenton, seconded by Commissioner Wilson, unanimous that Leonard be allowed to fence his land that is no longer need or used for a holding pen.

HEALTH BUDGET

Bruce Arnell, District Seven Health Department, met with the Commissioners and went over the Health Departments budget request of 1999. The group went over Clark County's portion of the budget. Arnell stressed that Clark County pays a high share of the budget per capita. He said the budget hearing will be held on the 28th of May, 1998. He said that Clark Counties portion for 1999 would be \$7472.

RE-ORGANIZATION OF P & Z COMMISSION

Ellen Tarpley, Planning & Zoning Administration, met with the Commission to up-date them on her department. She said the Planning & Zoning Commission have re-organized; electing Mary Grover-Chairperson, Conni Owen-Vice Chairperson and Ken Myers-Secretary & Treasurer. Tarpley said they need 3 new board members and the Planning & Zoning Commission recommends Brion Egan, Valeria Maxwell and Kevin Frederiksen. Motion by Commissioner Shenton seconded by Commissioner Wilson unanimous that Brion Egan, Valeria Maxwell and Kevin Frederiksen are hereby appointed to the Planning & Zoning Commission.

INDIGENT CASE APPROVED

The Board at this time went over Case No. 98-01 after some discussion motion by Commissioner Shenton, seconded by Commissioner Wilson unanimous that this person is indigent and the Welfare Director is directed to contact the vendors and offer settlement at EDS' pricing.

EQUIPMENT FOR WEED CONTROL

Keith Bramwell and Keith Tweedie, Weed Department, met with the Commission concerning need for new equipment for spraying. They encouraged the Commissioners to approve getting a chemical injector type system with a new dual wheel on the truck. Tweedie said the costs is around \$60,000. He said they can load all the chemical before you leave the shed. and can switch from one chemical to another. He informed them of

all the advantages like cuts the application time. They suggested putting equipment on a contract. He said they have ordered a roadside booster and tank. Bramwell said the university called and said they have a 83 ford, with 86,000 miles and four wheel drive that they will let the county use. He didn't know what kind of transmission it has. Bramwell up-dated the Commission on his progress and direction things are going with the U.S. Fish & Wildlife grant. Tweedie invited the Commissioners to attend their spray days on June 15, 16 and 17 on I-15 from Spencer to Monida. A group discussed was held on aerial spraying and how feasible it would be.


