AMBULANCE UPDATE

Lisa Sullivan, ambulance director met with the Board to update them on her department. Ms. Sullivan would like to have in place a consistent billing and collection procedure for the ambulance billing. It was suggested by the Board to contact an outside billing service, used by other county ambulances, and Gem Plan and see if there is a billing procedure that the billing department could follow.

ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT

Lisa Sullivan, economic development professional, met with the Board to update them on economic development matters. Ms. Sullivan reported that the day care will be opening

Monday, November 20, 2006. The county will pay the electric bill for their contribution, the forest service is providing the house, the school district will pay for the garbage service and provide janitorial services, and the city will waive the water and sewer costs. Ms. Sullivan is continuing work on bringing in a new business into Clark County.

ROAD & BRIDGE UPDATE

Mitch Whitmill, road and bridge supervisor met with the Board to update them on his department. The Department of Lands would like to modify the legal description of the State of Idaho Mineral Lease 7831 to be as follows: S1/2S1/2NE1/4, N1/2N1/2SE1/4 west of easement 4215 (county road to Kilgore), Section 1, Township 11 North, Range 38 East, B.M., containing 65 acres more or less. Christopher Lowman, Department of Lands, copied Clark County on a letter that was sent to Camas Creek Ranch, Dick Burkes. During the recent inspection of state grazing lease G8913 a "Private, Keep Out" sign had been placed on the gate approximately 100 feet inside the state boundary and Clark County has an easement for a public road to that point. Camas Creek Ranch was given two weeks to remove the sign. Prosecutor Simpson will send a letter from Clark County to Camas Creek Ranch. The Annual Road and Street Financial Report was reviewed and signed by the Board. Mr. Whitmill will be meeting with Casey Richardson, Idaho Transportation Department, to add additional roads to the county system. Porcupine Pass, Warm Creek to Lynn Tomlinson property, and Burkes to bridge will be added to the system. Mr. Whitmill reported that they are having problems with the water heater in the shop, it is still under warranty and it will be looked at.

JUVENILE PROBATION

Darin Burrell, Fremont County Juvenile Probation, postponed his meeting with the Board until December.

WEED UPDATE

Bo Billman, weed supervisor met with the Board to update them on his department. The Board reviewed and signed the modified BLM assistance agreement that ended September 30, 2006. Mr. Billman requested that the 2004 Suzuki Vincent be traded in or repairs will need to be made. Commissioner Leonardson moved to allow the weed department to purchase a 2006 Suzuki and trade in the 2004 Suzuki not to exceed \$4000 after trade in, seconded by Commissioner Edwards, unanimous. Mr. Billman also requested a new computer to accommodate working with mapping data, the Board asked Mr. Billman to bring quotes to the December board meeting. Mr. Billman, Keith Tweedie, and Virgil Valentine attended the EIWCA meetings last week. Mr. Billman reported that the counties will be given more control over noxious weed control. Mr. Billman also reported that a censor needs replaced on the white 1997 Ford pickup, \$440 is the approximate cost.

ALL HAZARD MITIGATION PLAN

Virgil Valentine, civil defense supervisor met with the board to update them on the all hazard mitigation plan. Mr. Valentine would like to send out a public participation questionnaire to help understand the perception of disasters to all rural property owners and about 20% of city residents. Commissioner Edwards moved to allow the public

participation questionnaires to be sent out, seconded by Commissioner Leonardson, unanimous. Mr. Valentine reported that Whisper Mountain is working on developing a county website.

COMMUNICATIONS

Virgil Valentine, civil defense supervisor met with the board to update them on communication equipment to be purchased through the FY 2005 Homeland Security Grant Program. The current system needs to be updated to a 700 MHz system to be able to communicate with other agencies. Motorola is going to perform a survey of the county to see what equipment is needed. Mr. Valentine reported that Boatman Springs needs an emergency generator that could be purchased with grant monies. Mr. Valentine also reported that leasing of sites for repeaters can also be paid with grant monies. Mr. Valentine presented the 2005 SHSP and 2005 LETPP equipment requests to the Board.

CLOUD SEEDING

The Board sent a letter to the Jefferson County Board of Commissioners asking for their support in continuing to help with the cloud seeding for Clark and West Jefferson County areas.

CANVASSING OF ELECTION RETURNS

The Board canvassed the returns of the general election, which was held November 7, 2006.
