MINUTES OF THE REGULAR MEETING OF THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS

CLARK COUNTY, IDAHO

SEPTEMBER 12, 1988

The Board met this day in regular session. Present were Commissioners J. Albert Laird, George H. Whittaker, Charles R. Vadnais, Prosecuting Attorney Jack G. Voshell and Clerk Jo Ann S. Tavenner.

MINUTES

Motion by Commissioner Whittaker, seconded by Commissioner Vadnais, unanimous that the minutes of the last regular meeting of the Board on August 8, 1988, be approved as written.

GRANT POSSIBLE FOR COMMUNITY CENTER

Lamone Baird and Don Watson from EIPCDA met with the Board and discussed grant funds to help build a community center for Dubois. Baird said a lot of the government red tape could be avoid and the grant could be funded through HCRC&D.

Watson said that it costs around \$24.00 per square foot including the heating system etc on the West Jefferson Senior Citizen Building; This grant was a block grant for low to moderate income people. He figured the cost of a center would be around \$100,000. or less. They asked if the board would be in favor of using the Road & Bridge crew and equipment plus other local organizations help with the construction of the building which would be considered in kind and count the same as cash.

Dan Lucas, County Extension Agent, reported to the Board that the Fair Board has accumulated funds in the amount of around \$36,000.

After some discussion it was unanimous that the Fair Board should hold a meeting within the next two weeks as the grant application would have to be turned in by November 10, 1988. A second alternative would be a loan to the Fair Board at 2% below prime rate.

BRIDGE INSPECTIONS DUE

Clint Kingsford, with Forsgren-Perkins Engineering, met with the Commission concerning bridge inspections. He informed the Board that they need to do something with Pleasant Valley Bridge. Also a discussion was held on the East Kilgore Road; Kinsford said the State has met with the Tri-Agencies and where the road could be designated as a forest highway there's the possibility of getting 100% funding and the contingency of getting the road built in the next two or three years. He said the costs for engineering would cost the county around \$26,000. The project would involve 1 1/2 miles of surface to the Kilgore intersection with two bridges one at Camas Creek and one at Spring Creek.

After a short discussion it was unanimous to put this project on hold until the Board receives assurance of when the road would be done.

OPENING BIDS ON SHERIFF'S VEHICLE

Motion by Commissioner Vadnais, seconded by Commissioner Whittaker, unanimous that the bid from Taylor Chevrolet of Rexburg, Id in the amount of \$16,687.22 be accepted.

BLUE CROSS TO INCREASE

Greg Helbling, Blue Cross representative, met with the Board and informed them that Blue Cross premiums would increase 30% on November 1, this year. Helbling said more people are using health benefits and that Medicare & Medicaid is paying less causing premiums to increase.

Helbing presented the board with two alternatives which would cut premium increases and still give the employees good coverage. After a short discussion it was unanimous that this Board would take Flex Group \$100 Deductible which would increase the premiums around 12% for employees families.

SPENCER PLAT

Mark Stetler and Mr. & Mrs. Ernest Lerner from Spencer met with the Commission concerning citizens from the City of Spencer using the measurements on the re-plat of Spencer and moving there fences out and obstructing the alley's and the streets.

After a short discussion it was unanimous that this is a City of Spencer matter and not a County.

AMBULANCE RADIO'S

It was brought to the Boards attention that the EMT'S are purchasing new radios and the School has requested that they would like to purchase for use of the bus-drivers when enroute to the bus runs by private vehicle so the school would have contact with the drivers.

After a short discussion it was moved by Commissioner Whittaker and seconded by Commissioner Vadnais, unanimous that the county hang on too and see if one of the county departments need them.

REQUEST FOR INDIGENT HELP

Case # 88-201 was presented to the Commission requesting help with hospital and doctor bills. The Board reviewed the application and requested that the clerk return the application and request that the petitioner complete the reimbursement agreement.
