

MINUTES OF THE REGULAR MEETING OF THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS

CLARK COUNTY, IDAHO

JULY 13, 1987

The board met this day in regular session. Present was Commissioners J. Albert Laird, George H. Whittaker, Charles R. Vadnais, and Clerk Jo Ann S. Tavenner.

MINUTES

Motion by Commissioner Whittaker, seconded by Commissioner Vadnais that the minutes of the last regular meeting of the board on June 8, 1987, be approved as written.

BOARD OF EQUALIZATION

The board met this day also as a board of equalization having previously considered the applications for Circuit-breakers. One protest was registered by Ted Sorsenson on the hydro-electric plant, Sorsenson said he had checked around and the majority of hydro-electric plants are assessed on the income approach not on the value, Henry Nagle stated that the hydro-plant was only assessed at 47% of the value for 1987. After some discussion Motion by Commissioner Vadnais, seconded by Commissioner Whittaker unanimous that the hydro-electric plant be assessed on the income bases and the value be lowered from \$2,710,060 to \$1,737,373 and there being no further protests on values for 1987 that the rolls be accepted as is and that assessments remain as entered on rolls, subject to homeowners exemptions which were filed previously.

STOCK-DRIVEWAY WEST OF INTERSTATE

James Port and Sam Grover, from Spencer met with the board concerning moving the stock-drive from China point Spencer to the West side of the I-15. They were given names of landowners on the West side of interstate.

CITY LANDFILL

La Monte Hodges, City Council member, met with the board and requested that if the County Attorney would draw up a deed from the City to the County on the city landfill area - the City would like to give the landfill to the County. He also stated that he had gone over the legal description with Bonnie Burns, County Treasurer, and she could furnish this for the Attorney.

EMERGENCY OPERATION ANNEX PLAN

Donald W. Shenton, Civil Defense Director, met with the board and explained the emergency operation annex plan and informed them on who was the department head. Also, stated an exercise will run sometime

RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, we the leaders and elected representatives of various local governments of the Great State of Idaho, in an all out effort to make state government become responsible for its own actions, and to fulfill our obligation to protect local taxpayers, who are continually being called upon to bare a greater and greater burden because of the ever increasing number of new programs and mandates being put upon local government by the state without providing adequate funding. BE IT ALSO RESOLVED that the undersigned Idaho counties and cities will use every means at our disposal to bring about and accomplish the intent of this resolution, up to and including, if necessary, taking appropriate action against those officials who continually seek to heap additional burdens upon our local taxpayers.

SMALL AND TARPLEY APPOINTED TO CLARK COUNTY FAIR BOARD

A letter received from Stephen Peebles submitting three names of persons agreeing to serve, if appointed, on the Clark County Fair Board. After reviewing the names Leland Small and Judy Tarpley were selected to replace Lois Sullivan and Stephen Peebles.

USE OF SPRAY RIGS

The question of individuals taking out Spray rigs for personal use was brought to the boards attention. After a short discussion it was unanimous that due to the condition and age of spray rigs that equipment would be used only with County Employees operating.

UNION PACIFIC RR CROSSING

Commissioner Vadnais brought up the problem of the Union Pacific railroad crossing, on A-2 leaving Dubois East, being so rough and said there is lots of complaints- After a short discussion it was unanimous a letter be sent to Union Pacific Railroad Company and see about getting it fixed.

QUARTERLY REPORTS APPROVED

Motion by Commissioner Whittaker, seconded by Commissioner Vadnais, unanimous, that reports of the Clerk and Sheriff be accepted as reported.

COLLECTION OF WEED SPRAYING BILL

It was brought to the boards attention the possibility of not being able to collect on a weed spraying bill. It was unanimous that any persons not paying would be notified by letter that if not paid it would be added to their taxes.

LEASING TRUCKS

Eldridge Russell met with the board and requested permission to lease trucks for a few day to hauling gravel to the Montevue road.

AMBULANCE DISTRICT

Ernest Sill met with the Commission and presented them with a petition signed by 150 residents requesting that the board form an Ambulance District that would include the entire area of Clark County and provide 24 hour a day ambulance service by levying the appropriate taxes to pay for service.

Sill said he feels that this service could be provided for around \$30,000 or if County could get two people to volunteer for summer

months the ambulance could go on operating as it now does. Forming of an Ambulance district will be published and set for a public hearing.

MONTEVIEW ROAD

Clint Kingsford, Co Engineer met with the board concerning Montevue road North. Kingsford said they did a core drill and that it didn't meet spec's for state approval of overlay - he recommended chips & seal for now and work toward reconstruction in 4 or 5 years.

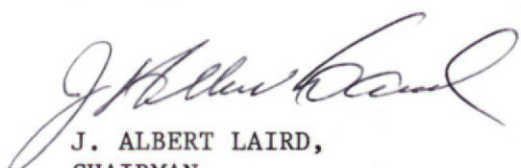
