

**MINUTES OF THE REGULAR MEETING OF THE BOARD
OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS
CLARK COUNTY, IDAHO**

DECEMBER 8, 1997

The Board met this day in regular session. Present were: Commissioners' Charles R. Vadnais, Charles E. Wilson and Gregory A. Shenton; Prosecuting Attorney, Craig Simpson and Clerk, Jo Ann S. Tavenner.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES

Motion by Commissioner Shenton, seconded by Commissioner Wilson, unanimous that the minutes dated November 10, 1997, be approved as written.

WEED UP-DATE

Keith Bramwell, Weed Supervisor, met with the Commission to up-date them on his departments. He said that the Weed Advisory Board would meet on December 9, 1997. Bramwell said that the weed board invited people from Jefferson County to the Advisory meeting, as they need to workout a program with them concerning weeds and controlling weeds. He said they are going to try to spray at least 5000 acres of weeds in 1998; and up the release of flea beetles for leafy spurge. He also informed them of a TMDL workshop (clean water act) on Thursday, December 11, at the Shilo Inn from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m. concerning water-users and their rights. Bramwell said that Ellen Taylor, a schoolteacher at the high school, is interested in the weed program and would like to work with the youth on the "school-2-work" program next season. He said the University of Idaho is looking at hiring and putting computer technician in each district. He also said that there is classes be offered through the VO-TEC in Idaho Falls, and the internet which will help the local people and youth in the community.

ROAD & BRIDGE UP-DATE

Rod Belcher, Road Supervisor, met with the board to up-date them on his department. He informed them of a letter from ITD reporting a bridge on Camas Creek being unsafe. He said bridge is not used that much, but his crew will fix it in the spring. Belcher said he had a request from Newman for rejects from the state pit west of Wildings' at Reno point. He said the Red road is finished to the Fremont county line and the crew is now working on the East Camas Cottonwood road. Belcher said they have two trucks ready to plow snow if they need to. Commissioner Wilson informed the group that there are three timber sales in Kilgore area, one which is near Dave Hart's place. Belcher also reported that the pump on garbage truck needs replaced.

CLOUD SEEDING

Conni Owen met with the Commission concerning what their plans are for cloud seeding this season. Commissioner Wilson informed the group that they have been trying to get an answer from ICRMP as to if they will insure the group or the county. As of this date they have had no reply. Owens' said she has talked to a different insurance company and they will not insure her. Wilson said they are going to use Clark County as an example on the cloud seeding done here. He said that other counties will put their money into cloud seeding also. He said Butte and Lemhi counties are willing to set up generators for cloud seeding in their counties.

PLANNING & ZONING

Conni Owens, Planning & Zoning Representative, said that the P & Z Board is concerned about a job description for Darrel Williams and what the boards responsibilities are. She said that they feel like they have and are wasting their time. She was informed that Lee Nellis would be here in February and give them some guidelines. A group discussion was held on the spending of the budget, after which it was unanimous that all decisions, claims and payroll authorizations would be prior approved, by the Planning & Zoning Board, before it goes to the Commissioners.

CANCELLATION OF TAXES

Bonnie Burns; Tax Collector met with the Commission and requested a cancellation on tax notice # 1148. Burns said that the property was traded from Sullivans' Livestock to BLM and the value did not get changed to an exempt status before the roll was approved. Motion by Commissioner Shenton, seconded by Commissioner Wilson unanimous that tax notice No. 1148 to BLM in the amount of \$5.66 is hereby canceled.

RESOLUTION NO. No. 97-06

AT A MEETING OF THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS FOR CLARK COUNTY, IDAHO, ON THE 8TH DAY OF DECEMBER, 1997, THE FOLLOWING RESOLUTION WAS UNANIMOUSLY ADOPTED, TO-WIT:

WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners of Clark County, Idaho, having the authority to set fees for juvenile probation, detention and other service/programs under authority of the Juvenile Corrections Act, Idaho Code Section 20-501, et seq., and

WHEREAS, the Commissioners having deemed it necessary to charge juveniles for use of the juvenile justice system;

NOW, THEREFORE, be it resolved by the Board of County Commissioners of Clark County, Idaho as follows:

The fee for juvenile probation, detention and other services/programs are set as follows:

Formal Probation agreement - Monthly monitoring fee of \$20.00

Diversion Program/Informal Adjustment Fee - One time fee of \$20.00*

* for up to 3 months. If longer than 3 months then an additional charge of \$10.00 per month.


Detention Fee - Secure detention per day \$98.00

Legal/Public Defender Fee - Will be assessed against the parents at an amount to be determined by the Judge.

Community Service - \$0.60 per Community service hour ordered






LIQUOR LICENSES APPROVED

The Commission reviewed the following applications for liquor & beer licenses for 1998:

Motion by Commissioner Wilson, seconded by Commissioner Shenton unanimous that the above are hereby approved and the Clerk is directed to issued liquor and beer licenses of the same.

APPROVAL OF SUB ROLL

The Board met at this time as a Board of Equalization. There being no persons protesting their values, a motion was made by Commissioner Shenton, seconded by Commissioner Wilson, that this roll is approved with a value of \$1,740,629.

SALE OF BRONCO

Craig King, Sheriff, met with the Commissioners concerning their signing a law enforcement agreement with other counties on a state-wide basis. Agreement was signed. The Board said that they have had some complaints from some residence on Sam Hulse riding with local officers. King informed the Commission that he can do this as a level-1 reserve officer, which enables him to hold his certificate. King also stated that Hulse receives no pay.

King said that they got the pickup that was leased for Deputy May use. He said he would prefer that they sell the 1996 Bronco and keep the 1995 Bronco because it handles better. After some discussion the decision was left up to King on which vehicle to keep.

CORRECTION ON RESOLUTION NO. 96-01

After the Commission and Attorney reviewed Resolution No. 96-01 adopted by the Board on February 14, 1996 the Commission decided to make the following correction was needed:

In recognition of the harmful effects that the use of alcohol or illegal drugs can have on county officials and employees and the public at large and that the use of alcohol or illegal drugs by county officials and employees while on the job is more likely to cause accidents and injuries, both of officials, employees, co-workers and the public-at-large;

RESOLUTION NO. 97-07

NOW THEREFORE, CLARK COUNTY, Hereby resolves as follows:

That the use of alcohol or illegal drugs by a county official and/or employee while on the job is prohibited, **and further provided that no county official and/or employee shall show up for work having any alcohol or illegal drugs in their system.** That the possession of alcohol or illegal drugs by a county official and/or employee while on the job is prohibited and that the transportation of alcohol or illegal drugs by a county official and/or employee in a county vehicle or while on

county time is hereby prohibited.


THAT the violation of any of the above-described prohibited acts may lead to the immediate termination of said county official and/or employee, at the discretion of the Commissioners.


