

MINUTES OF THE REGULAR MEETING OF THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS

CLARK COUNTY

December 9, 1991

The Board met this day in regular session. Present were Commissioners Charles R. Vadnais and Steven R. Gilger, Prosecuting Attorney, Craig Simpson and Jo Ann S. Tavenner, Clerk.

MINUTES

Motion by Commissioner Gilger, unanimous that the minutes of the last regular meeting of the Board on November 12, 1991, be approved as written.

CANCELLATION OF TAXES

Betty Kirkpatrick, Assessor and Bonnie G. Burns, Treasurer, met with the Commission and requested cancellation on the following taxes :

Mobile Home destroyed by fire last spring - Owner Vern & Joyce Kulhanek Value \$7004 - Tax Charge \$88.72.

Motion by Commissioner Gilger, unanimous that taxes in the amount of \$88.72 is hereby cancelled.

Double wide mobile home - moved from the county before January 1 - Owner Robert Wilson - Value \$3178. - Tax Charge \$30.14.

Motion by Commissioner Gilger, unanimous that taxes in the amount of \$30.14 are hereby cancelled.

Real Estate - lots inside the the City of Dubois - Owner Craig King - value was assessed too high in the amount of \$675 for the following years 1988, 1989, 1990 and 1991 - 1988 Tax Charge = \$8.90 - 1989 Tax Charge = \$9.12 - 1990 Tax Charge = \$9.56 and 1991 Tax Charge = \$8.56 or a total charge of \$36.14.

Motion by Commissioner Gilger, unanimous that taxes in the amount of \$36.14 are hereby cancelled.

Motion by Commissioner Gilger, unanimous that the above warrants are hereby cancelled.

STATE-FEDERAL LAND SWAP

Commissioner Gilger said the state and federal government are doing a land swap in Modoc area. He said the objective is a net gain of 640 acres of wildlife habitat, 13 acres of wet lands and 1 1/4 miles of live stream; the section in holding is surrounded by National Forest. Gilger said that he didn't know how this will effect the county as far as PILT or Forest Funds payments.

After some discussion it was unanimous that Commissioner Gilger should check this out more with the Forest Service.

PUBLIC DEFENDERS

The Commission having received a letter from Fremont County Commissioners inviting them to go in on a contract with a law firm to provide services to counties as public defenders.

After some discussion it was unanimous that this board is interested, but would like to know more about the costs before making a commitment.

APPROVAL OF SUB-ROLLS

The Board at this time was presented with the sub-real and personal property rolls. There being no protests made on the value it was unanimous that the rolls are approved and accepted with a value of \$1,134,954.

ROAD & BRIDGE UP-DATE

Rod Belcher, Road & Bridge Supervisor, met with the Commission. The group discussed waste oil furnaces. Belcher said that a waste oil furnace set up would cost approximately \$5000. He said that Cowboy Oil Company from Pocatello is picking up the county's waste oil now, but the county is still responsible until it is disposed of. The main concern was what to do with the waste oil once the landfill west of Dubois is closed, as there are a few people who change their own oil in equipment and vehicles and they won't be able to put in the dumpsters. Belcher said that Bob Henry went to work for Bonneville county and now the county will have a new inspector on the landfills which may require the county to put gates on the landfill and have hours when they can dump. He said that they are starting on the dumpster area at Montevue and that the state doesn't want to let the land at the Y in Kilgore go as it is between two sections of state owned lands. They are reconsidering leasing the ground back to the county where the old dump use to be by the cinder pit.

Belcher reported on the two trucks he got fixed recently and said that he found a used 1986 Dodge pickup with a little over 60,000 miles on it for \$2391. and that he had already had a call on getting lane plowed into a ranch on Medicine Lodge.

REQUEST TO USE COUNTY CAR

The Commission having had a request from Orvin Jorgensen to use the old Chev that Daniel Lucas drives, for a drivers education car at school this year. After some discussion it was unanimous that whereas the school let the county use a school bus for 4-H camp each year, if there is no problem with the insurance, Jorgensen could work out a schedule with Lucas and use the car.

INDIGENT CASES REVIEWED

The Board at this time reviewed two indigent cases presented - Case #214 approved for payment. Case # 216 - Case was denied unable to contact persons involved had moved from the county.
