

MINUTES OF THE REGULAR MEETING
OF THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS

CLARK COUNTY

December 12, 1994

The Board met this day in regular session. Present were Commissioners: Charles R. Vadnais, Steven R. Gilger, and Charles E. Wilson, and Clerk Jo Ann S. Tavenner.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES

Motion by Commissioner Gilger, seconded by Commissioner Wilson; unanimous that the meeting minutes from the November 14, 1994 are approved as written.

SHEEP STATION REQUEST FOR ROAD PLOWED

Sharon Weller, Sheep Station met with the Commission to explore options available to have the Road & Bridge Dept. plow the road from I-15 to station, etc.. Weller said their equipment is getting old and not powerful enough. After some discussion it was unanimous they would talk to Rod Belcher, Road Supervisor and get back to her.

CANCELLATION OF 1994 TAXES

Bonnie Burns, Tax Collector and Betty Kirkpatrick, Assessor met with the Commission and requested the following cancellation on 1994 taxes.

Adella M. Hodges - Value was entered at \$4400.00 and should be \$300.00 requests for a total cancellation of \$48.74 on tax receipt #350 to correct this error. Motion by Commissioner Gilger, seconded by Commissioner Wilson unanimous. Cancellation of \$48.74 is hereby granted.

Daniel E. Lucas moved last December; and Assessor's office took his homeowners exemption off. House was not rented during this time and Gayle moved back after the first of the year and has lived there most of 1994. The Lucas' feel that they are entitled to a homeowners exemption for this year even though she was gone for 6 weeks or two months. Cancellation would be in the amount of \$156.18 on their tax notice. Motion by Commissioner Gilger, seconded by Commissioner Wilson, unanimous that cancellation be given for 1994 only.

Kirkpatrick also stated that Ted Sorenson is concerned about being charged for some of the Simmons buildings in Section 31 and 32 of T10N Rge 30 EBM. A lengthy discussion was held on pro's and con's of this matter. After which it was turned over to the Attorney Craig Simpson to take care of.

EXPENSES FOR CLOUD SEEDING

Don Shenton, met with the Commission and reported that they have five generators for cloudseeding around the county. Shenton asked if the Board intended to pay expenses to Greg Shenton as they did last time. After some discussion it was unanimous the county will pay Greg Shenton \$10.00 per trip to help cover costs on taking care of generator at milepost 10 on Kilgore Road by Garner's Corner. Shenton also reported that they will hold hazardous material training school here if he can get five to seven people interested. He's going to check with Forest Service and Sheep Station.

OPEN BIDS

The Board at this time opened a bid they received on

(1) 1976 GMC; fulltime 4x4, V-8, black pickup.
Virgil R. Hathaway of Pocatello, Idaho gave the board a bid of \$3627.00. Motion by Commissioner Gilger, seconded by Commissioner Wilson that they will accept Virgil Hathaway's this bid.

REVOLVING FUND FOR SHERIFF DEPT.

Craig King, County Sheriff met with the Commission and reported he is having new phone system installed in jail for the inmates use. He said they will control the calls and county will get thirty percent income for controlling calls. King requests that he be allowed to set up revolving fund for traveling for his office. After some discussion it was unanimously approved and the Attorney Simpson will draw up a resolution for such.

RS2477 OR SECTION 5

Harold Wilson, Chairman of Planning and Zoning Commission met with the Board and reported that he is unable to keep up with all the correspondence, etc. for Planning and Zoning. The group discussed the need to hire someone to do these things. They also discussed the need to get roads through Federal Lands tied up by filing on before the deadline of January 20th or take a Section five for thirty years. No decision's made at this time.

ROAD & BRIDGE & SOLID WASTE UPDATE

Rod Belcher, Road & Bridge & Solid Waste supervisor met with the Commission to report on his departments. He said Larsen has been dumping paper in the dumpster at processing plant and feels we should increase the fee if it continues. The group discussed closure plans for dump west of town. Belcher informed the Board about a small pug mill Jefferson County has which can be operated with an end loader to mix cold mix. He said he would like to try this type of equipment on the first three miles south of town. Discussion held. Belcher also requested permission to purchase a new pickup. Motion by Commissioner Gilger, seconded by

Commissioner Wilson unanimous that Belcher has permission to get bids on a new pickup.

CANCELLATION OF WARRANT

Jo Ann Tavenner, Auditor requested a cancellation on Current Expense Warrant # 95-1639 in the amount of \$12.50. Reason for cancellation was it is a duplicate payment. Motion by Commissioner Wilson, seconded by Commissioner Gilger unanimous that County Auditor is hereby authorized to cancel warrant # 95-1639.

APPROVAL OF LIQUOR LICENSES

The Board at this time reviewed the following applications for liquor and beer licenses:

Motion by Commissioner Gilger, seconded by Commissioner Wilson unanimous that the above applications are approved and licenses were signed by the Board.

Motion by Commissioner Gilger, seconded by Commissioner Wilson unanimous that this claim is hereby denied and that employees should get prior approval on claims of this matter.
