

**MINUTES OF THE REGULAR MEETING OF THE BOARD
OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS
CLARK COUNTY, IDAHO**

SEPTEMBER 11, 1998

The Board met this day in regular session. Present were Commissioners' Charles R. Vadnais, Chairman, Charles E. Wilson and Gregory A. Shenton, Prosecuting Attorney Craig Simpson and Clerk Jo Ann S. Tavenner.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES

Motion by Commissioner Shenton, seconded by Commissioner Wilson, unanimous that the minutes for August 10, 1998, be approved as written.

DISPOSAL OF SURPLUS PROPERTY

Craig King, Sheriff, met with the Commission concerning surplus copy machine in his office. King said that he is unable to get parts to repair the machine and requested permission to dispose of it and purchase a new one. Motion by Commissioner Shenton, seconded by Commissioner Wilson, unanimous that King is authorized to dispose of item # 00752 copy machine and purchase a new one.

King informed the Commission that he received a bid of \$5,750.00 on the Thiokol snowcat from a H. Jackson Shirley III. After some discussion a motion was made by Commissioner Shenton, seconded by Commissioner Wilson unanimous that this bid be denied, King will notify the bidder.

ROTOMIL TAILINGS TAKEN AT SPENCER

Jack Martinez, Spencer, met with the Commissioners concerning rotomil tailings taken at the Spencer stock pile. Martinez informed the Commission that Chuck Bowen had come down where he was working, on street into his place during the weekend of July 4, and suggested that Martinez go to the stock pile and get rotomil tailings to fix the street by his house. He said that he didn't know the stock pile was county property when he took it. Rod Belcher, Road Supervisor, said that he measured the pit and 184 yards were gone. A discussion was held on how much was taken and the cost. After which Belcher was told to go out and measure the road surface, with Martinez, and then charge Martinez \$10.00 per yard. Martinez was in agreement that this is fair price.

CD MEETING SET

Virgil Valentine, Civil Defense director, met with the Commissioners and showed them the new draft he has been working on for a table top discussion, set for September 23, 1998, at 1 p.m., with all departments. Valentine requested that the Commissioners write a letter concerning the use of the Civil defense radio systems. He said that the system is being abused. Some users are using vulgar language, important transmissions are being interrupted and some users are using it for non-county business and he feels it should be stopped before it becomes a real problem or we lose our license.

The Commission were informed that Zane Baller, from Menan, would like to be connected on to the county radio system so he can serve as an advanced EMT for Clark County until they can train & qualify more personnel as advanced EMT'S. Valentine said that priority on the system should be Civil Defense first, second should be Law Enforcement, third Ambulance or EMT'S, and then the general or other users like road & bridge, school district etc. They talked about putting road & bridge on a frequency by its self. All frequencies or communications should be used for business only.

WEED UP-DATE

Keith Bramwell, Extension Agent, met with the Commissioners to up-date them on the weed department. He said they need to spend moneys to qualify for the grant or they may not get all their allotted money. He said they are having problems with the two dodge trucks. The group discussed the boom buster system, with the injection system. He said if there is a way he would like to try to maintain a crew of three for the next spray season.

It was brought to the Commissions attention that the weed department budget has a short fall of funds in the amount of \$13,799.50; due to grant funds not being received as forecasted by the weed supervisor. After a short discussion the following resolution was adopted.
