

MINUTES OF THE REGULAR MEETING OF THE BOARD
OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS
CLARK COUNTY, IDAHO

March 11, 1996

The Board met this day in regular session. Present were Commissioners: Steven R. Gilger Vice Chairman and Charles E. Wilson, Prosecuting Attorney Craig Simpson and Clerk Jo Ann S. Tavenner. Absent was Charles R. Vadnais, Chairman.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES

Motion by Commissioner Wilson unanimous that the minutes for the month of February 12, 1996 , are hereby approved as written.

AGREEMENT SIGNED WITH FOREST SERVICE

Craig King Sheriff met with the Commission and presented them with the annual operating and the financial reimbursement plan for the year 1996 between the Forest Service and the county Law Enforcement. After reviewing the agreement as a group Commissioner Gilger and Craig King, Sheriff signed the document.

ROAD & BRIDGE UP-DATE

Rod Belcher, Road supervisor met with the Commission to up-date them on his departments. Belcher presented the Commission with a purchase agreement with Idaho Asphalt Supply Inc.; which would supply his department with road oils for 1996. The contract which had been piggyback on Bingham Counties oil Bid for 1996. The contract was as follows:

The price on the above quantity will remain firm for 1996 and are based on minimum 27 ton loads. Motion by Commissioner Wilson unanimous that the contract be signed with Idaho Asphalt Supply for the 1996 season.

CREDIT CARD AUTHORIZED FOR CLERK

Jo Ann S. Tavenner, Clerk requested permission to obtain a credit card to use for guaranteeing reservations for the various departments. Tavenner said that she has been using her own in the pass, but would prefer that she didn't have to use her anymore. Motion by Commissioner Wilson unanimous that Jo Ann S. Tavenner Clerk is hereby authorized to purchase a visa or master card for this purpose.

WEED CONTROL UP-DATE

Orvin Jorgensen and Keith Bramwell met with the Commission and the group talked about the roadside spraying done with the chemical campaign for the road department during the last spraying season. The Group discussed what they had sprayed, what worked and what didn't. Jorgensen said that they need to get started spraying with arsenal as soon as possible as this chemical needs the spring showers to work. Jorgensen also said that with the price of 2-4D going up maybe they should use tordon and forget the 2-4D. He said that arsenal should have an extra punch and do the job. The grouped about doing a pilot program by joining forces with the Forest Service, BLM, State and the County to solve some of the weed problems. They talked about getting a new chemical rig with an injection unit that will reach further and carry about six different kinds of chemicals at once. They estimated the machine will cost about \$40,000. Bramwell informed the Board that he has already discussed a pilot program with the State, Forest Service and BLM. Jorgensen talked about the leafy spurge, toad flax and other noxious weeds patches cropping out all over the county and what they can do about it.
